

Determining Course Equivalents for Middlebury Institute (MI)'s 30-unit Advanced Entry MATFL Program

If you are a UCSC Language Studies or Linguistics major, you need (the equivalent of) at least 7 MI semester units to be eligible for MI's Advanced Entry MATFL Program. You can transfer as many as 10 MI semester units.

See the chart below for the equivalencies between UCSC courses and MI semester units. (If a Ling or APLX is not listed, it is not equivalent to MI semester units.)

Remember: All UCSC courses must be completed with a grade of B or better, and no more than 5 years before you apply to MI. You must be fully qualified for admission to MI's program, as determined by MI; credits will be accepted at their discretion.

Ling 50	2/3 of Language Analysis	2 (you take the 3rd unit at MI)
Ling 80C PLUS Ling 154	Intro to Sociolinguistics	3
APLX 135/235	Principles & Practices of Language Teaching	3
Language courses (up to 6 units in the teaching language, at MI's 400 level)	required language component	up to 4 semester units

MI's Language Requirement: Your proficiency in the teaching language must be evaluated as equivalent to MI's 400 level, as assessed through a 2-3 page writing sample in the teaching language, combined with a faculty phone interview.
